Talking of highly visible, I'm sure like me you will have seen the damage the weather has caused to our roads. Remember your ID when you vote

For the first time, Harrow residents voting in London's Mayoral and Assembly elections on 2 May, will need to show photo ID at the polling station.

No ID means no vote. Acceptable forms of ID include a driving licence; Blue Badge; or UK, EEA or Commonwealth passport. You can find a full list on our website. Alternatively, apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate online or using a paper form from the council's elections office by 24 April.

To have your say in May you must also be registered to vote by 16 April – it takes five minutes.

Friendlier, greener, spaces on the way

More places to sit, public art, planting and wider pavements – these just some of the things you told us you wanted to see during our consultation on enhancing Harrow town centre. With designs now finalised and your ideas on board, construction is set to begin in the next few months. It will be funded by £7.1 million from the government's Future High Street Fund with £1.1 million from the council.

Meanwhile, a corner of Greenhill Way car park is set to offer new opportunities for start-up businesses and local creatives. When complete the new hub will comprise flexible retail units, affordable workspace, community facilities and event space.

The car park will continue to offer more than 200 spaces and one hour's free parking.

inter weather is hard on our roads - low temperatures and rain are a perfect recipe for potholes. Keeping on top of repairs is a big job and in the last 12 months alone we've filled more than 1,500.

To help with this ongoing battle, we're investing £241,000 in new machinery and a new approach. Together this should mean faster and better repairs for Harrow's roads.

We're about to assemble a pothole squad that's empowered to 'find and fix' road problems wherever they occur. We hope this proactive approach will mean potholes are spotted earlier and filled more quickly. The squad will have to work hard to cover Harrow's more than 280 miles of roads, and reports of problems from residents will continue to be important.

We're also investing in the latest technology. The pothole busting machine from JCB pictured, eradicates potholes in minutes and leaves behind a fix that's as good as the rest of the road. And it does this with fewer emissions and less waste than traditional methods.

e've launched a consultation on our draft Local Plan, which will help to shape development in Harrow and show what kind of borough we want to live in. The Local Plan will steer Harrow into the 2040s, so it's important that residents have their say.

Restoring price

ast year we asked you about You also said you wanted us to take

ast year we asked you about the neighbourhood problems you care about most. You said you wanted your council to continue to take tough action on things like littering, street-drinking, spitting in public and dog fouling.

Using additional powers, we're able to fine people who commit antisocial acts, as part of what's known as Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs). With these now in place, we plan to ramp up the way we deal with people who break the rules.

With our new PSPOs we're able to issue on-the-spot fines of £100 for offences including spitting, public urination, littering, smoking in play areas and parking on grass verges. You told us that you find these things unacceptable, and we agree.

You also said you wanted us to take action on other issues including loitering that causes distress or intimidation, use of fireworks in the street, and riding a bike or scooter irresponsibly. These and other issues have been added to our borough-wide PSPO for the first time.

We want Harrow residents to feel proud of where they live, to feel safe, and enjoy clean streets and green spaces. Our PSPO framework gives us the tools to enforce your neighbourhood priorities and sends a strong message that antisocial behaviour won't be tolerated here.



ur regular weeks of action coordinate local services to tackle issues in specific neighbourhoods. Most recently, council staff, Police and others formed a joint taskforce to focus on antisocial behaviour and community safety in Wealdstone.

This reassuring and highly visible presence received a very positive response from local people and businesses. Many appreciated the expert advice on offer and the chance to chat about our work to improve public confidence and residents' safety.

The task force visited properties

where antisocial behaviour has been previously reported and hot-spot areas identified by residents through the Harrow Safer Places map.

New homes

Bright future

he regeneration of Harrow has taken a leap forward with our new business plans that will deliver quality, affordable family-sized homes, with green and public spaces on council-owned land.

The plans, like many others, had been disrupted by the global spike in inflation and regulatory building safety changes. But the programme is now firmly back on track.

We are working in partnership with Wates to transform three key council-owned sites. The revamped plans will deliver more family housing, lower heights, and less dense developments sympathetic to their surroundings.

Our old headquarters at the Civic Centre on Station Road will be known as Poets Corner.

The old driving school left empty for the last 20 years, next to the Leisure Centre, will also be redeveloped and become Byron Quarter.

Byron Quarter (Phase 1) – responds to residents' comments on earlier designs. It has less height and more family-sized homes (61 more houses).

It is better integrated with Byron Park and Belmont Trail. The proposed new low-rise housing development will consist of 149 new homes - with a current proposal of 27% affordable homes.
