There is no mention of improving transport connections around London from Harrow and Wealdstone station. When the area was designated an opportunity area there were promises of Crossrail stopping at H&W and everything was very optimistic. Trains going to Euston are packed during rush hour and people often cannot get on - these need to be more frequent. There is still only 1 train per hour to Clapham / west London. There seems to be no thought around improving Harrows links to massive development opportunities in Old Oak Common...despite a train line from H&W almost going through the new HS2 station. The connectivity potential of H&W seems to be recognised but this section of the plan appears to have had very limited thought / ideas / energy.
