de Ar	e growth assigned to the Opportunity Area is disproportionately high, placing an excessive strain on the area. Since its establishment in 2013, it has already divered over 3,500 units. The area itself is relatively small, covering just 69 hectares compared to the borough's total of 5,047 hectares. The Opportunity ea's housing capacity has been repeatedly revised—from an initial estimate of 2,900 units to the current 9,352—now representing 58.3% of the borough's tall housing target of 16,040 units. Given that this area makes up only 1.3% of the borough's total size, this allocation is clearly inequitable.
jus	e London Plan 2021 sets the Opportunity Area's capacity at 5,000 homes and 1,000 jobs. This target is expected to be met by 2029, and there is no stification for adding an extra 4,352 units. Further residential development in the Opportunity Area is unnecessary. Instead, the remaining sites should be ed for family housing that fits the character of the area, preserving the low-rise nature of Station Road.
ov reg to	current development trends continue, the Opportunity Area will have delivered nearly 13,000 homes by the end of the plan period. The area is already ersaturated, which is diminishing the quality of life for both existing and new residents. Adding more flats would only exacerbate these issues. Previous generation efforts have worsened inequality within the borough, particularly for those living near the Opportunity Area, where infrastructure strain has led a decline in living standards. For example, power outages have become more frequent in these neighbourhoods. Despite 11 years of regeneration, the ear remains rundown, dirty, and unappealing, suggesting that the regeneration strategy is failing.
he ne	e Harrow and Wealdstone Opportunity Area differs significantly from other large redevelopment zones like Wembley (239 hectares) and Brent Cross (151 ctares), which are located on large, separate plots of land, often former industrial sites. These areas are less constrained by surrounding residential ighbourhoods, making it unrealistic to expect the same outcomes from Harrow and Wealdstone. In particular, areas like Station Road, which borders lower eneighbourhoods, are not suitable for high-density development.
pr	oposal: Retain a housing capacity of 5,000 units for the Opportunity Area and allocate remaining sites for more appropriate development. The original oposal in Regulation 18 suggested a capacity of 7,500 units, which has since been raised to 9,352. Further increases in capacity are not sustainable or stified.
